Shortcake:

175g butter	175g sugar
1 egg	1 tsp vanilla
350g flour	1 1/2 tsps baking Powder

Cream butter & sugar, add egg then vanilla. Sift in flour & baking powder, mix well. Refrigerate for 30 minutes.

Line a 23cm x 33cm (approx.) high sided baking tray with baking paper & press chilled cake into it. Bake at 175oC for 20-25 minutes or until firm & a light biscuit colour. Allow to cool. While cooling make marshmallow.

Place 1 ½ Tbsp gelatine in a small bowl, add 1 ½ Tbsp water, mix & leave to swell for 5 minutes.

Dissolve 1 ½ cups sugar in 1 ½ cups water over a medium heat, then add gelatine mixture, stirring to dissolve. Take off heat & cool completely, then beat until thick for approx.10 mins, add 2tsp vanilla & beat another minute.

Spread over cold base, leave to set, then ice thinly with chocolate icing.
